MAY BUDGET REVISION ADDRESSES CALSTRS FUNDING

The highlight of the May Budget Revision that was submitted to the State Legislature by **Governor Brown** last week was the aggressive proposal to retire the unfunded liability of CalSTRS. As reported before, STRS' liability is nearly \$74 billion and if not addressed immediately, will cause the system to run out of funds by 2045. CalSTRS' Defined Benefit Program for its 860,000 members is funded through contributions from the state, employers (school districts), employees and returns on investments. CalSTRS lost about 40 percent of the value of its investments when the stock market plunged in 2008. Though the \$183 billion value has now returned to where it was, the pension program is only about two-thirds funded to meet projected pension payouts over the next 30 years. Because changes to contributions to CalSTRS can only occur through legislation, STRS officials have been lobbying lawmakers for many years to address this issue and are pleased with the Governor's plan. CalSTRS issued a press release that stated, "We applaud the proposed [revision](#) to the Governor's Budget that fully funds the Defined Benefit Program in approximately 30 years in a manner that shares the responsibility among all parties and respects the contractual rights of California's educators..."

The proposal includes increases to employee, employer and state contributions to the retirement fund through gradual steps over the next several years.

- **Employee Contributions**—Employees now contribute 8% of their earnings each pay period. This amount will increase to a total of 10.25% by 2017, in this manner: 8.15% in 2014-15; 9.2% in 2015-16; and 10.25% in 2016-2017. This applies to all those who joined the system prior to January 1, 2013. Those who joined after this date will be capped at 9.21%.
- **Employer or District Contributions**—Currently, employer contributions are 8.25% of payroll. This will now take a huge leap to 19.1% phased in over the next seven years. This will be an increase of 1.25% in 2014-15, followed by increases of 1.6% in the 2015-16 through 2020-21 school years.
- **State Contributions**—This year, the state is contributing approximately 3% of member payroll to CalSTRS. The proposal increases that to 6.3% in 2016-17. What is reassuring is that the state is going to continue to pay the 2.5% that is necessary to retain the highly popular inflation protection program from which CalSTRS members benefit.

While this plan will have immense ramifications for school districts in terms of their financial commitments, Governor Brown made it clear that pension obligations are part of the cost to educate children, saying, "The key point that is sometimes hard to grasp is that this is what it takes to educate our

kids...To get what they need, they need teachers. Teachers get what they need by having a pension. The pension has to be paid for.” The bulk of the pension contribution increases will be borne by school districts, nibbling away (7 – 10% and more) at the increased funding they expect under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).

ACSA has taken the position that the July 1, 2014, implementation of the contribution changes is problematic, as districts are currently in the process of finalizing their budgets and won’t have enough time to prepare for the changes. LAUSD Superintendent **John Deasy**, along with other California superintendents, is lobbying legislators in Sacramento to delay the implementation of the proposal at least one year to avoid having to make budget cuts. Dr. Deasy is quoted in the *Los Angeles Times* stating, “This is something I am very worried about...We’ve made commitments to the community...now we have to decide what to cut. We will lose credibility.” District employees have been hoping for raises and job restorations that may be jeopardized if the Governor’s current proposal is adopted by the Legislature.

Our elected officials find themselves in a difficult position, because every year that action is not taken to address the CalSTRS liability adds hundreds of millions of dollars to the deficit. On the other hand, employees will view the increase to their STRS contributions as a salary cut and if districts refrain from granting raises in order to meet the sizable employer contribution increase, it will be perceived as a double blow. Recognizing that the proposal puts districts in difficult financial positions of having to decide where to make cuts to meet new obligations and whether to give employee raises, State Senate President **Darrell Steinberg** has noted, “We have to be very careful with how we do this,” while Assemblyman **Rob Bonta**, *Chair of the Assembly Committee on Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security*, says, “We have to take the leap together...It’s absolutely necessary...”

We must all keep in mind that the May Budget Revision is a proposal. Employee unions, educational and professional organizations and community groups will be making their voices heard in the next few weeks. It is likely that modifications will be made before the final budget is passed by the State Legislature as required by law by June 15, 2014.

We will keep you apprised of this continually evolving story.

NO ADDITIONAL STATE BUDGET FOR ADULT SCHOOLS

The May Budget Revision did not make any significant changes to funding for adult education; however, the **Brown** Administration and the Legislature committed to addressing the needs of adult education in the 2015-16 budget process. One important provision that was included in the May Budget was the suspension of establishing new federal Workforce Investment Act (WIA) affiliated charter schools and charter schools that offer correctional education. This has been a concern since an adult-focused charter school started earlier this year in Northern California. The issue is that these schools can claim LCFF-based funding for adult ADA, which no other school district may claim.

The California Council for Adult Education is focused on obtaining a comprehensive plan for adult education that ensures the stability of both the Community College and K-12 adult schools. The organization is initiating a grassroots advocacy push to apply pressure to protect K-12 adult schools as work begins on the draft 2015-16 budget.

HEALTH BENEFITS FAQ

TOPIC: CERTAIN LIFE EVENTS QUALIFY FOR MAKING MIDYEAR CHANGES

What are the guidelines for making changes to my health plans outside of the Open Enrollment period?

For employer-sponsored health plans, the IRS requires that plan selections be made during Open Enrollment. Once selections are made, a change cannot be made **unless** you have a “qualifying” life event. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) acknowledges that individuals may experience major life changes that affect their health benefits and thus, HIPAA allows for special enrollment in health plans outside of the open enrollment period.

Which IRS “life events” qualify for making a change in my District health plans?

Qualifying life events under HIPAA include:

- Retirement
- Beginning or ending full-time employment
- Moving in or out of a plan’s service area
- Marriage, divorce or death of a spouse
- Changes in dependent status
- Birth of a child or legal adoption
- Adding or losing Medicare eligibility
- Other qualifying events, including death of a covered child, spousal loss of employment, spousal gain or loss of employer health plan coverage

Are there time limits for making midyear changes?

Yes, you must submit your changes within 30 days of your life event by completing the required documentation.

What happens when an employee or spouse and/or dependents lose their health coverage?

When employees and/or their dependents lose their District-paid health insurance due to job loss, divorce, dependent child age limits or other life events, they have several options: They may purchase continued coverage in their current health plan through a federal program called COBRA or they may purchase an individual plan through California’s health insurance marketplace—Covered California. Federal COBRA coverage may continue for 18 months. Domestic partners are not eligible for COBRA benefits; however, they may be eligible for Cal-COBRA. In California, Cal-COBRA extends coverage for an additional 18 months. STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

While educators in the Los Angeles area have been focusing on the election to fill the Board of Education seat vacated by the death of **Marguerite P. LaMotte** in December, another race important to public education is also on the June ballot. Voters may decide the next Superintendent of Public Instruction if one of the contenders garners more than 50% of the vote. If not, the top two winners will face each other in November. The position is currently held by former teacher **Tom Torlakson** who has two major challengers, **Marshall Tuck** and **Lydia Gutierrez**. AALA has not taken a position on this election, so we will provide some general information about the candidates.

Tom Torlakson (64), former teacher and Assembly member, is the incumbent in the race. He is a strong supporter of teachers and unions and has pushed for increased funding for schools. Mr. Torlakson is an ally of **Governor Jerry Brown** and has refused to establish guidelines linking teachers' evaluation to test scores. Along with the Governor, he took a stance against the federal government and refused to administer some standardized tests this year. He is endorsed by many current legislators, L.A. City Council members, LAUSD Board Members **Vladovic**, **Ratliff** and **Zimmer**; CFT; CTA; UFW; CSEA; *Los Angeles Daily News*; and the California Democratic Party, among others. Torlakson has raised about \$1.3 million for his campaign.

Marshall Tuck (40), former CEO of Partnership for Los Angeles Schools and President of Green Dot Schools, is the challenger with the most exposure. He is supported by philanthropists and education reformers, along with some of those on **President Obama's** education team. Sacramento Mayor **Kevin Johnson**, former L.A. Mayor **Antonio Villaraigosa**, the *San Francisco Chronicle* and the *L.A. Times* have all endorsed him. He is seen as an education reformer who wants to try new approaches, reform the seniority system and give more local control to schools. Mr. Tuck supports the Vergara lawsuit that seeks to have teacher tenure protections declared unconstitutional and is a proponent of the *parent trigger law*. He has raised \$1.2 million for his campaign, primarily from members of Silicon Valley technology and investment firms, **Eli Broad** and employees of his educational advocacy foundation and **Bill Bloomfield**, a major Republican donor.

Lydia Gutierrez is a teacher from Long Beach who ran against Tom Torlakson in 2010. She has nowhere near the money or name recognition of her opponents and is running a grass roots campaign with just a few thousand dollars. She has been particularly critical of the Common Core and blasts the closing of adult and career education schools throughout the state. She advocates for fiscal responsibility and wants to increase trades and skills programs in schools. Ms. Gutierrez is the only candidate running as a Republican and could be the wild card in this election.

**BARGAINING BULLETIN:
UNIT J'S EMPLOYER-PAID MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS TO CALPERS**

On May 15, 2014, the Unit J Bargaining Team and the District reached agreement to address recent changes to CalPERS under the Public Employee Pension Reform Act of 2013 (PEPRA). Effective July 1, 2014, the law requires all CalPERS eligible members to pay 100% of their individual employee contributions to CalPERS at the rate fixed and prescribed by law. The agreement provides for employees in Unit J whose member contribution is currently paid for by the District to receive a 1.2% wage increase to base pay in order to offset the elimination of the employer-paid member contributions.

While this agreement is separate and apart from any future agreement for Unit J members to receive a negotiated raise, it will mean higher 12-month-period earnings. Employees would be able to retire earlier and receive the same retirement allowance. If they choose to retire on their original date, they would receive a higher retirement allowance.

**THE POWERSAVE SCHOOLS PROGRAM RETURNS
FOR ANOTHER YEAR TO LAUSD**



Southern California Edison (SCE) is continuing its partnership with the Alliance to Save Energy to sponsor the PowerSave Schools Program in a select number of LAUSD schools for the 2014-2015 school year. SCE has dedicated resources to the PowerSave Schools Program as part of its commitment to expanding energy-efficient programs and reducing energy use in LAUSD schools. The PowerSave Schools Program educates students about energy and energy efficiency through hands-on activities that promote STEM learning. The program provides a Road Map Guide that includes instructional materials correlated with the Common Core Standards and Next Generation Science Standards, as well as diagnostic tool kits that support inquiry and project-based learning.

Schools participating in the PowerSave Schools Program may earn a reward from LAUSD's Power Challenge competition by reducing 5% of their electricity and water use (up to \$1,000) and can be very competitive in the District's Power Challenge grand prizes (this year the prizes are \$10,000, \$15,000 and \$25,000 for the best energy-saving records in each of the four Educational Service Centers). Five elementary schools with the PowerSave Schools Program in the South ESC this year have a combined electricity savings of 18.0%, which represents savings of \$24,543 for the District through February.
