MCKENNA AND JOHNSON IN RUN-OFF ON AUGUST 12, 2014

With 100% of the votes cast at local precincts counted, the AALA PAC-endorsed candidate for LAUSD Board of Education, **Dr. George McKenna**, received 44.3% followed by **Alex Johnson**, with 24.7%. Although the counting of absentee ballots has not been complete, it appears that no candidate will receive 50% of the votes; therefore, McKenna and Johnson will face each other in a special election on August 12, 2014, to determine who will serve the balance of the late **Marguerite P. LaMotte's** term. While only 13% of the electorate bothered to cast their votes, the election for the District 1 Board seat was hotly contested and AALA is very pleased with the results of the election as it again shows that money does not always determine the winner. Alex Johnson, with his strong political connections, raised more money than all of the other six candidates put together, and over twice as much as Dr. McKenna.

The election on August 12 is critical for the District. Whether McKenna or Johnson, the winner will assume a key role on the Board of Education, probably becoming the tie-breaking vote on many policy decisions. In addition, the residents of District 1 have not had a vote since the December 2013 untimely death of Ms. LaMotte. It is noteworthy that neither the wealthy philanthropists nor the Coalition for School Reform, who were so active in the 2013 Board election, have been visible. It will be interesting to see what happens now that the final campaigning is beginning. Also, since none of the UTLA-backed candidates made it into the run-off, who its PAC supports could potentially play a large role in the election as well as SEIU, Local 99.

Several articles in recent *Updates* have highlighted the work of Dr. McKenna and detailed the myriad reasons he received the endorsement of the AALA PAC and members should be able to see how he compares to his opponent. Alex Johnson, 33, has a law degree and is an aide for Los Angeles County Supervisor **Mark Ridley-Thomas**. His resumé indicates that his teaching experience consisted of a short stint instructing high school seniors in constitutional law as a substitute in Washington, D.C. Mr. Johnson also worked for a brief time in the New York Department of Education where his website notes that he assessed teachers' instructional strengths and provided professional support. (*Hmmmmmm...how does one do that with virtually no teaching experience?*) Most of his other professional experience has been working with legislators on both coasts. His campaign raised more than \$350,000, with \$80,000 coming from the California Charter Schools Association's PAC. Many California politicians (but no other education-connected organizations) have endorsed Mr. Johnson, assumingly because of his connection to the politically-powerful Mr. Ridley-Thomas and his colleagues.

It is most clear to us that **Dr. George McKenna** is the better qualified candidate who is against the privatization of public schools and who has also received endorsements from politicians (**Maxine Waters, Tom LaBonge, Jan Perry, Bernard Parks**) as well as AALA, CSEA, COBA, Latino Coalition, *L.A. Times, La Opinión, L.A. Sentinel* and numerous other groups and individuals. He will be a thoughtful, practical and knowledgeable Board member with no need to take time to get up to speed on the current operations of the District. Other than the information on the website, Mr. Johnson is an unknown quantity whose short track record shows he clearly has political aspirations. He wants safe schools, secure funding and quality teachers. (*Who doesn't?*) Los Angeles voters should look carefully at the candidates and vote for commitment, vision, experience and knowledge.

TORLAKSON TAKES THE LEAD

In another closely watched race that affects education, State Superintendent of Public Instruction **Tom Torlakson** obtained 46.9% of the vote in his bid for reelection. His two competitors vying to be on the ballot with him in November, **Marshall Tuck** (Green Dot, Partnership LA) and **Lydia Gutierrez** (Long Beach teacher) obtained 28.6% and 24.4%, respectively, in a race that will not be determined until all absentee ballots are counted.

AN ALTERNATIVE PLAN FOR CALSTRS FUNDING DEFICIT

The June 15 deadline for California to have a 2014-15 budget is rapidly approaching. You may recall that **Governor Brown** presented an ambitious May Budget Revision last month that addressed the \$74 billion unfunded liability that CalSTRS is facing. The proposal mandates that school districts would increase their STRS contributions by 1.5% beginning July 1, 2014, while employees' contributions would increase by only .15%. School district leaders, professional organizations and other groups began immediately lobbying lawmakers to delay the implementation of the changes until July 1, 2015, citing that most districts have nearly completed their 2014-15 budgets. The Local Control Funding Formula mandated that districts develop their budgets and accountability plans in collaboration with parents and other stakeholders. Multiple meetings have been held and goals, services and expenditures necessary to support strong academic and social outcomes for students have already been determined. To have to go back and change them because of a reduction in anticipated revenue puts an untenable burden on school districts. **Leilani Aguinaldo Yee**, LAUSD Deputy Director of Government Relations, testified during a two-hour hearing in Sacramento last week that the District would lose \$35 million from its budget and would be forced to make significant changes, thereby eroding the trust that has been established with parents and community groups.

Assemblyman **Rob Bonta**, D-Oakland, and Senator **Norma Torres**, D-Pomona, who chair committees looking into the pension issue, have endorsed an alternative plan that reduces the increased contribution amounts of school districts by 50% in 2014-15. This proposal was suggested by CalSTRS and would have the districts make up the difference with higher payments in future years. The alternative plan would still leave intact the other key elements of the Governor's plan to eliminate CalSTRS' deficit. The budget must be finalized by June 15, so a decision on the new plan has to be made soon.

HEALTH BENEFITS FAQ

TOPIC: YOUR HEALTH PLANS AND COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE

What is meant by *complementary and alternative medicine*?

National reports indicate that about 40% of adults utilize some form of *complementary* or *alternative* medicine (CAM). The National Institutes of Health’s (NIH) definition of *complementary* medicine typically indicates nonmainstream medical approaches used together with mainstream practices. This combination is also called *integrative* medicine. *Alternative* medicine refers to health practices used **in place of** conventional medicine. Health care providers are increasingly offering integrative medicine. CAM therapies include massage, acupuncture, chiropractic care, natural products (examples: fish oil/omega 3, glucosamine, flaxseed, etc.) and many others. An example of integrative or complementary medicine might be offering cancer patients acupuncture, massage, counseling and other therapies to ease pain and side effects of treatment.

Do our health plans offer any complementary and/or alternative therapies?

All of our medical plans offer limited CAM therapies. *Spinal manipulation* and *acupuncture* are two therapies offered by most of our medical plans. Research by NIH shows these therapies to be effective for certain conditions—spinal manipulation for low back pain and acupuncture for chronic pain. For alternative therapies not covered directly by our medical plans, most provide referrals for discounts.

What specific alternative therapies do the LAUSD medical plans provide for active employees and retirees under age 65?

- **Anthem Blue Cross Select** offers acupuncture and chiropractor visits with a \$10 copay per visit. Coverage is limited to a 60-day period of care after illness or injury for chiropractic services.
- **Anthem Blue Cross EPO** provides chiropractic coverage limited to 24 visits per calendar year. Acupuncture coverage is limited to 12 visits per calendar year with a \$30 copay per visit.
- **Health Net** (HN) contracts with American Specialty Health Plans (ASHP) of California to offer chiropractic coverage up to 20 visits per year. To access this care, members select a contracted chiropractor from the HN directory of providers at: <http://www.healthnet.com/lausd>. Members may access a contracted chiropractor without a referral from their Primary Care Physician.
- **Kaiser HMO** does not cover chiropractic care. Physicians may refer members with nausea or as part of a pain management plan for acupuncture treatments with a \$20 copay per visit.

Is complementary or alternative therapy coverage different for Medicare retirees?

Yes. Medicare Part B pays for *manual manipulation* of the spine to correct a subluxation (when one or more of the bones of your spine move out of position) with no limits on the number of visits. Medicare Part B does not cover acupuncture.

- **Anthem EPO** provides the same chiropractic and acupuncture coverage for Medicare retirees as for active employees, as described above, for a 60-day period after an injury or illness.
- **Health Net Seniority Plus** covers 20 chiropractic visits per year, with a \$10 copay per visit. Acupuncture is not covered.
- **Kaiser Senior Advantage** covers *manual manipulation* of the spine to correct subluxation (in accordance with Medicare guidelines) by a participating chiropractor of the American Specialty Health Plans of California, Inc. (ASH Plans) with a \$5 copayment per visit. A referral by a Kaiser

physician is not required. Acupuncture services are provided only for the treatment of nausea or as part of a comprehensive pain management program for chronic pain with a \$5 copay per visit.

- **UnitedHealthcare® Group Medicare Advantage HMO** covers routine chiropractic care for 12 visits per year. Medicare-covered chiropractic care (*spinal manipulation*) is differentiated from routine chiropractic care. The copay for both types of chiropractic services is \$5 per visit.

LEADERS TO LEARN FROM, PART II

Last week we highlighted eight of the sixteen educators who had been selected by *Education Week* as 2014 *Leaders to Learn From*. This week, we will provide an overview of the balance of those to receive this recognition. *Education Week* sought nominations from administrators' groups in all 50 states and the Education Writers Association and more than 900 nominations were submitted. - **Kelvin R. Adams & Mary J. Armstrong**, Superintendent and Teachers' Union President of St. Louis Public Schools, teamed together to reverse a decline in student enrollment by using funds from a court settlement to increase the number of preschool seats.
- **Gail Pletnick**, Superintendent of Dysart Unified School District in Arizona, adopted the *Move On When Ready* program which provides a competency-based pathway to high school graduation utilizing personalized learning and technology. Students move on when they've fully grasped concepts and ideas, regardless of the number of days in the classroom; some have earned their diploma as early as their sophomore year.
- **Nicholas Gledich**, Superintendent in Colorado Springs District 11, led district officials in emergency management when the community was faced with a wildfire, saving student records, attending to displaced families and finding space for 1500 firefighters and forest workers.
- **Dan Walker**, Assistant Superintendent in Lower Kuskokwim School District in Alaska, increased the number of distance-learning courses through the use of videoconferencing, making it accessible to students in small, remote communities that, due to weather, are often cut off from the outside world. In addition to regular academic courses, students have access to robotics, digital photography and e-journalism.

- **Robert Runcie**, Superintendent of Broward County Public Schools in Florida, has changed a previously contentious relationship with charter schools to one of collaboration and cooperation by holding thrice-yearly meetings to discuss concerns and establish a positive working environment.
- **Dennis W. Creedon**, Assistant Superintendent in the Philadelphia School District, has championed the arts, bringing community resources into the schools, advocating to keep art, music and dance in the curriculum and mandating that every school would have art or music and that every student would have at least one lesson per week.
- **Mary Newell**, Director of Nursing in Kent School District in Washington, established an in-school clinic in the district's alternative high school with regular meetings between nurses and classroom teachers to follow-up on students' health needs.
