BARGAINING BULLETIN: AGREEMENT REACHED FOR AALA CERTIFICATED UNIT

On July 2, 2014, AALA President **Dr. Judith Perez** e-mailed members the great news that after months of intense negotiations, on June 27, 2014, the AALA certificated bargaining team reached tentative agreement with the District on AALA’s 2014-2017 certificated contract. The Board of Education approved the agreement on July 1, 2014; however, it is not final until AALA members ratify it later this month when they are back at work. The process for ratification will take place online, July 24-29, 2014. Details will be published next week.

AALA Certificated Administrators’ Memorandum of Understanding 2014-2017 A SUMMARY (Revised)

1. Compensation

2013-2014	2% off-schedule, lump-sum salary payment, on a one-time basis (date TBD) If any other LAUSD unit receives a higher lump-sum payment, AALA members will receive it, too.
2014-2015	2% on-schedule wage increase [<u>Note</u> : typo in agreement corrected]
2015-2016	2% on-schedule wage increase*
2016-2017	2.5% on-schedule wage increase*

*Contingency: increased District revenues or decreased operating expenses

If the Board of Education approves a higher general percentage increase on the base salary table for another group of employees for any of the years covered by the agreement, AALA will receive comparable treatment.

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AGREEMENT (Cont.)

2. Evaluation

2014-2015 Each AALA member who has completed five years of service will receive a performance bonus if he or she has received satisfactory evaluations, no overall “below standard” evaluations and no rendering of discipline (bonus amount to be negotiated).

The parties agree to negotiate a four-level evaluation rating during this year for implementation in 2015-2016.

2015-2016 Each AALA member who has completed five years of service will receive a performance bonus if he or she has received an evaluation of “effective” or “highly effective” on the four-point evaluation scale and no rendering of discipline (bonus amount to be negotiated).

4213/4214: The District has the right to release an employee in a 4213/4214 status at any time. Such an employee shall be given timely support, guidance and feedback, orally and in writing, even during years when he or she may not be formally evaluated. This section is not subject to the grievance procedure.

Note: Several members requested clarification about this section. Its significance is that this will be the first time that those in 4213/4214 status are part of the AALA contract. Their positions were originally established via District administrative regulation. Even more importantly, this section obligates the District to provide support for beginning administrators. AALA believes that such support is essential to their success.

What is a 4213/4214? In the past, the District offered exams every few years to determine who qualified for AP and principal positions at elementary and secondary levels. Those who passed their respective exam were placed on an unranked list for their class. APs and principals were selected from the appropriate list. When the lists were exhausted and a position opened up, a person was appointed in accordance with Administrative Regulation 4213. The “4213” administrator was required to pass the exam next time it was given. A person not on a list can be appointed pursuant to Administrative Regulation 4214 if he/she has special skills needed for a particular school, e.g., being bilingual. Nowadays since no exams are given and there are no lists, virtually all school-site AP and principal positions are 4213/4214.

Co-Locations

2014-2015 AALA and the District will review ways to provide additional support for District co-location sites.

4. Reopeners

For the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, parties agree to reopen on base salary rate.

For the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, parties agree to reopen on a total of two additional contract articles.

While AALA's certificated bargaining team did not get everything it tried to get, it was successful in ensuring the gains and protections highlighted in bold in this summary. For example, if another bargaining unit gets a higher percentage salary increase, AALA members will also receive it. If increased revenue comes to the District from the State, AALA's bargaining team will push to increase compensation for our members in the upcoming years. Finally, the team commits to continue advocating for improved working conditions for all of our members. A collective bargaining agreement is, after all, always a work in progress.

AALA Classified Unit: Negotiations Continue

AALA's Unit J (classified) bargaining team, which started bargaining later than our certificated unit, is getting close to reaching a tentative settlement with the District on its separate negotiations. We plan to share details soon. The ratification process will take place as soon as possible thereafter.

VERGARA CASE GOES TO NEW YORK

The initial success of the Vergara case in California (an appeal is pending) has led to a similar suit in New York that has been filed by a group called the New York City Parents Union on behalf of eleven students. It argues that the tenure laws violate the New York State Constitution's guarantee of a "sound basic education" by making it difficult to fire bad teachers and by protecting the most veteran teachers in the event of layoffs, regardless of their quality. Unlike the Vergara case, the Parents Union says that the suit is not being bankrolled by outside interests. As you may recall, the plaintiffs in the California case were funded by Silicon Valley entrepreneur **David Welch's** foundation, Students Matter, and alleged that tenure laws deny students their fundamental right to equality in public education. Once the judge issued his decision, the California attorneys announced that this was just the beginning of a series of cases that would be filed around the country.

In a separate case, former CNN news anchor **Campbell Brown** is leading a group called Partnership for Education Justice that has met with six New York families and encouraged them to file a suit that will challenge teacher tenure and seniority laws in the state. The group has also offered to provide support to the families during the trial. Partnership for Education Justice has received hundreds of thousands of dollars from Campbell Brown who will not identify other donors, only saying that they are a bipartisan group. While following the money, we find that her husband, **Dan Senor** (former investment banker and advisor to **Mitt Romney**), is on the board of StudentsFirst, **Michelle Rhee's** controversial group that advocates for the parent trigger law and has received significant funding from **Michael Bloomberg** and **Laura** and **John Arnold** (Enron). It has been reported that David Welch met with Campbell Brown in

April and is probably providing financial backing for the case in New York. Other supporters of the Partnership include two former members of the **Obama** administration, **Robert Gibbs** and **Ben Laboit**. A representative of the Parents Union says that when the Partnership case is filed, the two may be combined.

While teachers unions were appalled at the Vergara verdict and have vowed to appeal, U.S. Secretary of Education **Arne Duncan** said he was very, very pleased with the decision which builds “a new framework for the teaching profession.” In the wake of his support for the lawsuit, the NEA voted to call for his resignation. **Carl Korn**, a spokesman for New York State United Teachers, said that he believes they will have more success defending job protections in New York; mainly because NY makes teachers wait three years and must have eighteen observations for tenure. Korn says, “We will vigorously defend due process and seniority rights against these attacks by billionaire hedge fund managers.” He also called the Partnership for Educational Justice an astroturf group funded by right-wing extremists.

The following is a summary of the first New York case that was published in the *Buffalo News* online on June 24, 2014):

Families are suing the State of New York, claiming that the institutionalized retention of ineffective teachers deprives each child of their right to a sound basic education as guaranteed under the New York State Constitution. There are three basic claims:

1. Similar to the recent groundbreaking Vergara ruling in California, the lawsuit will specifically challenge the “Last In, First Out” mandate in New York, stating that the policy of forcing school districts to base layoffs on seniority – not a teacher’s performance in the classroom – violates the state constitution by denying students access to effective teachers.

2. Also similar to Vergara, the lawsuit will claim that New York’s Tenure Statute forces administrators to either grant or deny permanent lifetime employment after three years – an arbitrary time period that does not provide administrators enough time to determine a teacher’s effectiveness. Also similar to Vergara, the suit claims that the complicated disciplinary statutes make it nearly impossible to fire or discipline ineffective teachers – creating a burdensome, costly, and lengthy process that rarely removes ineffective teachers.

GOVERNOR BROWN SIGNS BILL REGARDING DISMISSAL OF TEACHERS

Assembly Bill 215 was recently signed into law by **Governor Brown**. **Joan Buchanan** (D-Alamo) worked with CTA and advocacy group EdVoice in writing the bill which only addresses dismissal for egregious misconduct, mainly sexual and other abuse and drug offenses. The bill purports to cut the time and expense of litigating these cases and also prohibits districts from approving nondisclosure settlements and expunging accusations from personnel records if teachers agree to quit. ACSA opposed the bill saying that it is too narrow in scope and the timelines are too restrictive.

HEALTH BENEFITS FAQ

TOPIC: TRAVELING ABROAD? REMEMBER TO CHECK HEALTH ADVISORIES

I am traveling abroad this summer. How do I know if there are any health risks or need any special immunizations?

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has a *Travelers' Health* website with the very latest advisories on immunizations needed for the country or countries you may visit. To learn about health risks in the country of your travel, to obtain general *Travel Health Notices* and/or to view health updates, go to <http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/>. For example, if you're going to China this summer, you will see an updated notice about *Avian Influenza* and precautions to take while traveling. Certain other Asian countries such as Vietnam, Indonesia or the Philippines, are experiencing outbreaks of measles; learn about needed immunizations. There was even specific information for those traveling to Brazil for the 2014 World Cup games.

Be proactive about staying healthy during your travel abroad. You can do this by learning about your travel destination and seeing your doctor to ensure that your regular immunizations are up-to-date and whether additional ones are needed for travel. It is important to get vaccinated because some diseases that are not common in the United States still exist in other parts of the world.

How far in advance should I start checking for immunization needed for travel?

The recommended time is four to six weeks in advance of your departure date. Some vaccines, such as the typhoid vaccine may require taking prior to travel to the affected area. Other vaccines may cause uncomfortable side effects that you don't want to experience during your vacation.

Are travel immunizations covered by my LAUSD health plan?

Immunizations that are part of those recommended by your plan are covered. If you are a member of Kaiser, you have access to travel immunizations and vaccines through the Travel Clinic. You simply call the Travel Clinic with the dates of your travel and the country or countries to which you are traveling and a nurse will provide information on the immunizations or vaccines needed and how to obtain them. If you belong to Anthem Blue Cross or Health Net, travel immunizations are not covered, but may be obtained through your primary care physician.

What other information is helpful for traveling internationally?

The CDC website also provides advice on food, water and beverage safety while traveling, as well as symptoms when you should see a doctor. Information on food and water safety is available at: <http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/page/infographic-food-water-whats-safer>.

What if I get sick when traveling?

Remember that all of the District health plans provide for emergency treatment. Check your health plan for the details of your coverage. If you do get treated while traveling internationally, obtain written documentation about your condition, treatment and costs to ensure timely reimbursement.

THE LA FUND OFFERS PARENT EDUCATION PROGRAM



The LA Fund for Public Education recently received two grants to deliver parent education to 50 LAUSD schools implementing Breakfast in the Classroom. The training is focused on family health and nutrition. Priority will be given to schools rolling out the program this year, but all schools are encouraged to apply. The goal is to educate parents about the benefits of healthy eating and staying physically fit. The program could be a single session designed to introduce parents to the new breakfast program or as many as 4 sessions designed to help families get healthy and stay healthy.
