## HEALTH BENEFITS BUDGET MAINTAINED FOR TWO MORE YEARS!

On Tuesday, April 14, 2015, the Board of Education approved an extension of two additional years of fixed contributions for health benefits for the years 2016-2017, with the possibility of extension into a third year. This vote ensures that health benefits will be stable without the need to renegotiate for the next two years. A third year may be possible if the HBC can meet certain cost-saving contingencies.

The Health Benefits Committee (HBC), cochaired by **Tom Beatty** of the Teamsters Union and **Betty Forrester** of UTLA, include union presidents or designees from each of the bargaining units within LAUSD. Meeting monthly after each HBC meeting, the coalition of union presidents worked to shape the direction of the agreement.

AALA thanks Board President **Dr. Richard Vladovic** for his leadership role in working with Superintendent **Ramón Cortines** and the Board to pass this agreement. In addition to Dr. Vladovic, the five Board members who voted in favor of the agreement included **Bennett Kayser, Steve Zimmer, Dr. George McKenna, Tamar Galatzan** and **Mónica García**. **Mónica Ratliff** wanted more analysis on how the costs would affect the District's financial future. AALA commends Superintendent Cortines for his advocacy on behalf of employees and his resolve to meet the health and welfare needs of District employees and retirees.

### Highlights of the 2015-2017 Agreement

- The District will contribute about one billion dollars annually to maintain health benefits for 2015-2017.
- The HBC will utilize surplus funds accrued in a reserve fund to share the costs of premium increases.
- The HBC commits to reduce the current unfunded liability to cover costs for future retiree benefits.
- District health care contributions for 2018, the fourth year, may be extended under certain conditions.

## BARGAINING BULLETIN

Two important side-letters have been signed by AALA President **Dr. Judith Perez** and **Vivian Ekchian**, LAUSD Chief Labor Negotiator that affect both classified and certificated members of the association. They represent the culmination of negotiations over a long period of time by the AALA team on behalf of members to obtain some latitude in the use of bereavement and personal necessity time. There have been many cases throughout the years in which AALA members have been unable to attend significant life events because these activities did not fall within the very restrictive guidelines.

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## **BARGAINING (Cont.)**

Both Unit J and certificated members of AALA will benefit from amended language to Article XI, Sections 2.0 (certificated) and 8.0 (classified). In the original text, an employee was allowed to use bereavement time due to the death of an immediate family member within ten calendar days of the death. The side-letter amends the wording to allow bereavement absence within twelve months of the date of death. This will be beneficial to those members who may face some extenuating circumstances which do not allow the funeral, burial, etc., to occur within ten days of death.

An additional section has been added to the regulations regarding personal necessity absence to Article XI, Sections 5.0 (certificated) and 13.0 (classified) for AALA members. The new section is as follows:

... an employee shall be granted a paid personal necessity absence when ... [any] other significant event of a compelling nature to the employee, the gravity of which is comparable to the above, which demands the personal attention of the employee during assigned hours and which the employee cannot reasonably be expected to disregard, limited to one (1) occasion in any school year. This addition will allow AALA members to attend weddings, graduations and other significant events without having to misrepresent the reason for their absence.

These two side-letters are encouraging steps and show the willingness of the District to now address some concerns that have been raised by AALA members for several years.

## **UPDATE ON THE ATLANTA EDUCATORS**

Eight of the eleven Atlanta educators who were convicted of racketeering and other charges related to changing answers on their students' standardized tests were sentenced to prison by **Judge Jerry Baxter** on Tuesday, April 14, 2015. The judge metered out harsh penalties to those who refused to reach a plea bargain with the district attorney, saying, "Nobody has taken any responsibility that I can see. I was trying to give everybody one more chance. All I want from these people is for somebody to take responsibility."

The judge was visibly irritated and said that the real victims of the cheating scandal were the children who were passed through the school system because of falsified test scores. Many of the defense attorneys said that their clients turned down the plea deals because they would have to renounce their right to appeal and admit guilt. The sentences ranged from five to twenty years in prison, with actual time behind bars extending from one to seven years and the balance on probation. Two who did agree to a plea bargain received five years on probation, with home confinement, weekends in jail and community service.

## **SUPPORT THE FUTURE OF PRINCIPALS**

The American Federation of School Administrators (AFSA), National Association of Elementary School Principals (NAESP) and the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) have joined together in an effort to make sure that the provisions regarding principal and other school leader recruitment, preparation and retention are maintained in the current reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). It authorizes states to reserve three percent of their Title II funds for preparation and ongoing professional development of school leaders. Because the reauthorization of ESEA is in the proposal stages and mark-ups and amendments may still occur, these provisions may be eliminated by the time the final bill is ready for the vote. Therefore, AFSA, NAESP and NASSP are encouraging all school leaders to contact their elected officials to tell them what an important part the principal plays in school success and that support for them must be maintained in the reauthorization.

**HEALTH BENEFITS FAQ:  
*QUALIFYING FOR LIFETIME HEALTH BENEFITS AT RETIREMENT***

**How do I know if I qualify for lifetime health benefits when I retire?**

As a current employee, your eligibility for District-sponsored medical, dental and vision coverage for yourself and eligible dependents at retirement depends on meeting requirements for:

1. Qualifying years in paid service: A year of paid service means you were paid for at least 100 full-time days and you were eligible for District benefits.
2. Plan enrollment at retirement: On the date you retire, you must be enrolled in the plans you wish to continue during retirement.
3. Receipt of retirement benefits: You must receive a monthly retirement payment from your State Retirement System—either CalSTRS or CalPERS.

**What are the specific hire date conditions I must meet?** To receive lifetime benefits, your hire date must fall under one of the categories below:

- **On or before March 11, 1984**, and continued eligibility for District coverage for **five** consecutive years immediately before retiring.
- **On or after March 11, 1984, but before July 1, 1987**, and continued eligibility for District coverage for at least **10** consecutive years immediately before retiring.
- **On or after July 1, 1987, but before June 1, 1992**, and continued eligibility for District coverage for at least **15** consecutive years immediately before retiring, or **10** consecutive years immediately before retiring plus **10** nonconsecutive years.
- **On or after June 1, 1992**, and your age plus the number of your consecutive qualifying years of service, when added together, equals **80**.
- **On or after March 1, 2007**, and your age plus the number of consecutive qualifying years of service, when added together, equals **80** and you have **fifteen (15)** consecutive years of qualifying service immediately prior to retirement.
- **On or after April 1, 2009**, and your age plus the number of consecutive qualifying years of service, when added together, equals **85** and you have **twenty-five (25)** consecutive years of qualifying service immediately prior to retirement.

**What happens if I retire but want to defer receipt of my CalSTRS or CalPERS benefits payments?**

If you leave funds on deposit with CalSTRS or CalPERS system for withdrawal at a later date or for a lump-sum distribution, you are not eligible for District-paid retiree health benefits. If you stop your monthly retiree benefit payments, you will lose your District-sponsored benefits.

### THE IPAD SAGA CONTINUES

LAUSD is taking on Apple. AALA has just obtained a copy of a letter sent by LAUSD General Counsel **David Holmquist** to **Bruce Sewell**, Apple General Counsel, in which the District is terminating its relationship with Pearson for the dedicated software that was to be installed on the iPads as part of the Common Core Technology Project. Below is an excerpt from the letter:

*... the LAUSD will not accept or compensate Apple for new deliveries of Pearson Education, Inc. (Pearson) curriculum, and instruct(s) Apple to end the provision of Pearson products and services to LAUSD under Contract No. 1400028 as soon as possible, but no later than June 30, 2015. I would like...to discuss how to best accomplish the dissociation from Pearson and recoup the costs of Pearson licenses that we paid for but have been unable to use.*

*As you are aware, LAUSD is extremely dissatisfied with the work of Pearson...as the subcontracted curriculum provider. While Apple and Pearson promised a state-of-the-art technological solution... they have yet to deliver it...the vast majority of our students are still unable to access the Pearson curriculum on iPads...*

*Thus, the LAUSD will no longer use Pearson content...nor will we be making any further purchases of devices from Apple that contain Pearson content...*

In addition, the *Los Angeles Times* reported on April 16, 2015, that the federal Securities and Exchange Commission has now opened an informal inquiry into whether the District complied with legal guidelines in the use of bond funds for the project.

An internal memo from **Bernadette Lucas**, Director of what is now called the Instructional Technology Project, contained a litany of problems with the Pearson content:

- Teachers have had myriad problems trying to implement the curriculum.
- Only two schools out of sixty-nine are still trying to use the Pearson application regularly.
- Fewer than 5 percent of schools that received the iPads had consistent access to the Pearson curriculum.
- District staff have spent *thousands of hours* troubleshooting technical issues.
- Students cannot consistently access content.

## IPADS (Cont.)

- The Pearson System of Courses only partially meets the Office of Curriculum, Instruction and School Support standards for universal access.
- Attempts to make the Pearson System of Courses usable have required extraordinary, unsustainable and unscalable resources from the Instructional Technology Initiative, Information Technology Division and Pearson.

And so it goes...

## LOCAL OPTIONS OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

The Local Options Oversight Committee is offering schools interested in becoming an autonomous school one last opportunity to attend the two sessions that are required in order to submit the application. In addition, if a school has submitted SBM waiver requests, the Local School Stabilization and Empowerment Initiative (LSSEI) offers an opportunity for SBM schools to maintain their status and add on Local Initiative School (LIS) status. This one-time application process is similar to the process the school currently must complete each year for a SBM waiver.
