BARGAINING BULLETIN: NEGOTIATIONS SCHEDULED

UTLA members recently ratified the tentative collective bargaining agreement that was negotiated between UTLA and the District last month, and the Board of Education adopted it at their meeting on Tuesday, May, 12, 2015. The agreement is a three-year, \$607 million contract that includes a 10.36 percent salary increase over several years, a multitier evaluation system, reduced class sizes in 8th and 9th grade English/language arts and mathematics classes, summer school and increased counseling services.

Immediately after the tentative agreement, **Dr. Judith Perez**, AALA President, requested that the District schedule negotiations with AALA. This request was consistent with the

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that was agreed upon between LAUSD and AALA on June 27, 2014, in which the following was noted,"...should the Board of Education approve a higher general percentage increase on the base salary table for another group of employees, AALA will receive comparable treatment." This phrase is commonly referred to as the *me too* clause.

Negotiations with the District are expected to begin next week. It is important that AALA members (Unit J and certificated) understand that the *me too* clause in the MOU indicates that AALA will receive *comparable* treatment, not necessarily, the same treatment as another group of employees. Therefore, AALA members will not automatically be granted what was negotiated with UTLA. We must return to the bargaining table and work out an agreement that is comparable. We anticipate that our negotiations will be complete by the end of the school year. Remember, that as a result of our 2014 MOU, AALA members received a 2% bonus in August 2014 that was based on the 2013-2014 salary; UTLA members did not. We hope this clarifies the next steps in the negotiation process. We will keep you apprised of the results of the scheduled bargaining sessions. The chart below reflects the current AALA/LAUSD salary agreement and the new UTLA/LAUSD agreement.

HEALTH BENEFITS FAQ: MAY IS ARTHRITIS AWARENESS MONTH

Are you among those who purchase a supplement for pain relief from joint pain or arthritis? Join the crowd—a walk through the aisles of over-the-counter supplements and medications for joint pain at pharmacies and discount stores shows the prevalence of the problem.

How widespread is arthritis?

Arthritis affects 50 million U.S. adults over 18 years of age. It is the most common cause of disability in the United States.

What are the most common types of arthritis?

- Osteoarthritis (OA) This type of arthritis typically occurs in older adults. This joint disease mostly affects cartilage, the slippery tissue that covers the ends of bones in a joint. In OA, the top layer of cartilage breaks down and wears away. This allows bones under the cartilage to rub together. The rubbing causes pain, swelling and loss of motion of the joint.
- Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA) This type is considered an autoimmune disease in which a person's immune system attacks his or her own body tissues. It causes pain, stiffness, inflammation, swelling and, sometimes, destruction of joints.
- **Gout** This form of arthritis occurs when uric acid, a bodily waste product, deposits sharp crystals in the joints. Some 2.1 million Americans have gout.
- **Lupus** Like rheumatoid arthritis, in lupus, the immune system attacks the joint tissue and may affect the skin, blood, nervous system and internal organs. Lupus affects 9 to 10 times as many women as men. It typically begins during the early-adult years.
- **Juvenile arthritis** This arthritis is diagnosed before age 16, with the most common form, juvenile rheumatoid arthritis, affecting between 30,000 and 50,000 children nationwide.

What are some common misconceptions about arthritis?

- Arthritis affects older adults and is a normal part of aging. Not true. Arthritis can affect persons at any age, including children. Most of those with arthritis are younger than 65 years of age. Arthritis is not a normal part of aging.
- Arthritis is a single disease manifested by swollen, stiff and achy joints. An oversimplification. The word "arthritis" is used generally, but encompasses over 100 conditions. The most common types are described in the previous question.
- If you have arthritis, you should limit exercising. Not true. Research shows that people with many forms of arthritis can participate safely in appropriate, regular exercise.
- *Nightshade vegetables aggravate arthritis*. **Not scientifically shown.** Recent research suggests that nightshade vegetables might actually help reduce arthritis symptoms.

What should I do if I think I have arthritis?

Advice from medical experts all say to go see a doctor. If you use over-the-counter medications or supplements, be sure you tell your doctor. Only a doctor can tell if you have arthritis or a related condition and what to do about it. It's important not to wait.

BAIN V. CTA, ANOTHER ATTACK ON UNIONS

Bain v. CTA is the latest lawsuit to be filed against teacher unions specifically, but public employee unions in general. This lawsuit has been brought forward by StudentsFirst, the organization founded by former Washington, D.C., schools' chancellor **Michelle Rhee**, on behalf of four public school teachers. Named in the lawsuit are not only CTA, but UTLA, NEA, CFT, AFT, United Teachers of Richmond and various school superintendents. The plaintiffs (teachers from Los Angeles, West Contra Costa and Arcadia unified school districts) are challenging the law that allows unions to call them nonmembers because they only pay the agency fee. Those who only pay the agency fee exempt themselves from the political activities of the union, but also from some of the perks of membership such as voting on the contract, representation during conferences, extra insurance, etc. Bain and the other teachers in the suit say that it is unfair and unconstitutional (violates their free speech) for them to be denied any benefits of membership as a result of their decision to pay a reduced amount in union dues. In essence, they want to be able to both opt out of full membership in the union and pay significantly reduced dues, yet be able to vote for union officers and participate in other decision-making activities, which union rules currently prohibit.

Antiunion groups have been arguing for years that unions violate workers' First Amendment rights by charging dues. However, the question in this case is not that teachers can opt out of membership and pay a reduced amount of dues, but what benefits members and nonmembers receive from the union. **Moshe Z. Marvit**, a Philadelphia labor and civil rights attorney and Century Foundation Fellow, says that it is a strange First Amendment argument, that "...you should still have the right to vote in an organization that you don't want to be a part of...It is a strange irony of this case that the plaintiffs readily admit the myriad benefits that come with union membership, but argue that it is unfair to require them to be members of the union to get those benefits."

StudentsFirst, which is financially backing the suit, is funded by a virtual who's who of billionaires and right-wing education reform foundations that include the Walton Family Foundation, the Eli and Edythe Broad Foundation, the Charles and Helen Schwab Foundation, former New York Mayor **Michael Bloomberg**, hedge-fund managers **David Tepper** and **Alan Fournier**, Charter Schools USA and the Laura and John Arnold Foundation. Attorney Marvit concludes, "...this case...is litigation funded and promoted by antiunion groups that is part of a general strategy to defund unions, destroy solidarity and erase the benefits of union membership..."

WHY VOTE?

When the polls open on Election Day, every citizen over the age of 18 will be able to cast a vote. It is a right we take for granted, one that defines our nation as a democracy. But universal suffrage did not come without a fight. Many people have marched, protested, fought and died for the right to vote. Voting is one of the most important rights and responsibilities that U.S. citizens have. About 150 million American citizens are qualified to vote. Unfortunately, many don't. Don't give up your right to choose leaders and representatives who will do things that are important to you. If you live in the city of Los Angeles and have not done so already, vote on Tuesday and encourage your family members, friends and neighbors to do so as well.
