## NO MORE WANDING — NOW WHAT?

Because this issue received quite a bit of publicity, we are sure that you are aware that on Tuesday, June 18, the LAUSD Board of Education voted to end the safety policy requiring the random searches of students using handheld metal detectors (wanding). The policy was put in place in 1993 after students were killed at Fairfax and Reseda high schools. We must note that these were definitely not the first students to be killed on a LAUSD campus, several had lost their lives in the preceding years, but these shootings gained national attention because they occurred in schools that were not located in the barrio or ghetto and still had sizeable populations of white students. The District immediately began a pilot program calling for random searches of students using metal detectors. The policy evolved to mandate daily searches at all secondary schools in 2011 and was seen as a viable deterrent to students bringing to school weapons such as guns, knives, or any other item which might cause harm or injury.

As school shootings have become more prevalent throughout the country, districts have taken various measures to address student safety and security. Several have begun requiring that students wear identification badges at all times, while others have increased the presence of law enforcement, security guards, and/or mental health professionals. Many of the larger urban districts have increased the use of random searches with the help of metal detectors in an effort to deter students from bringing weapons on campus. Researchers at the Levin College of Law at the University of Florida found in 2016 that campuses with larger populations of students of color are far more likely to use more intense surveillance techniques that include a mix of metal detectors, random sweeps, and the employment of school police and security guards.

Several groups, including well-organized student and parent groups, the ACLU, and UTLA, have been voicing opposition to the policy in recent years, and despite a current pilot program that removed the actual wanding from the classroom so as not to disrupt instruction, the Board, in a 4-3 vote agreed to eliminate it altogether as of July 1, 2020. Their reasoning is that the practice takes away from instructional time and makes young people feel like criminals. In fact, many students who spoke felt that students were not randomly selected, but targeted. The Superintendent has been tasked with finding an alternative safety policy.

What is interesting to note is that the three Board members who voted against the policy were the career educators who have all served for many years as principals of secondary schools and we must give them kudos for standing their ground and following their consciences during contentious debates. **Dr. McKenna**, **Mr. Schmerelson**, and **Dr. Vladovic** believed that the policy was working and was a deterrent to weapons being brought on campus as attested by the low confiscation rate. Dr. McKenna also referenced a survey in which 78% of parents said they approved of wanding and he questioned what would be the alternative if the practice were to be discontinued.

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## WANDING (Cont.)

We are fortunate that Los Angeles has not had a mass school shooting and can attribute that to the preventative work that the District does on a daily basis, from the Division of School Operations to School Police to Restorative Justice; from School Mental Health to Parent/Community Services; from strong administrative staffs and the development of current, workable Safe School Plans to the involvement of students in managing their environments.

## HEALTHCARE FAQs— *THINK AGAIN ABOUT USING LAST YEAR'S SUNSCREEN*

### **I thought sunscreens had a three-year shelf life. Has that changed?**

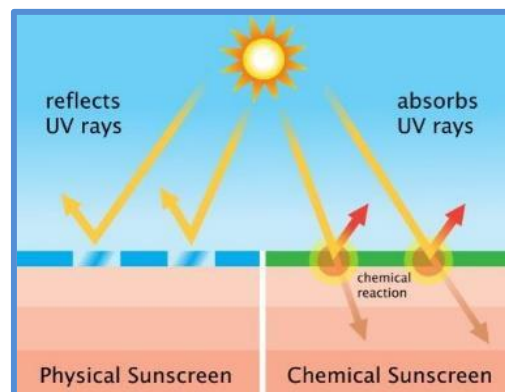
Yes and no. You may want to decide whether to use your leftover sunscreen based on the latest news. In February of this year, the FDA announced that only two of the sixteen active ingredients used in sunscreens—**titanium dioxide** and **zinc oxide**—are *generally recognized as safe and effective* (GRASE). Two other ingredients, **PABA** and **trolamine salicylate**, are **not** safe. Additionally, there is insufficient data to show whether the twelve other ingredients found in sunscreens are safe. The proposed new FDA rules affect the wide array of sunscreen products currently sold, industry testing of the twelve untested ingredients, SPF values, labeling, and broad-spectrum requirements. AALA readers may recall that last year, the state of Hawaii legislated a ban on sunscreens containing the chemicals **oxybenzone** and **octinoxate**. Scientists said that these chemicals contribute to the bleaching and destruction of coral reefs. The moves by Hawaii and the FDA are now in sync with longstanding warnings from environmental groups about the toxicity of known and yet untested chemicals prevalent in sunscreens.

### **What do these new rules mean for my “old” sunscreens and new ones currently being sold?**

The changes proposed by the FDA won't be in place for at least another year. So, if you want the safest and most effective sunscreens, look for titanium dioxide or zinc oxide as active ingredients when purchasing. The nonprofit Environmental Working Group offers a [2019 Guide to Sunscreens](#) with hundreds of ratings on sunscreens, based on safety and effectiveness for personal use and for the environment.

### **Why are titanium dioxide and zinc oxide better than sunscreens with other active ingredients?**

There are two types of sunscreens—chemical and physical. Chemical sunscreens are the most common types sold on retail shelves. They contain organic compounds, such as oxybenzone, octinoxate, octisalate, and avobenzone and work by absorbing

UV rays and dissipating them. Physical sunscreen, often referred to as “sunblock,” contains active minerals such as titanium dioxide or zinc oxide. They work by sitting on top of the skin and deflecting UV rays.

### **What should I know about applying sunscreen before going on outdoor outings?**

- Do not rely on sunscreen alone to prevent skin cancer—combine sunscreen with protective clothing. Don’t forget to wear sunglasses to protect your eyes.
- Read the label of a product before you use it and to follow the directions.
- Apply generously to cover the whole body. Wear sunscreen under clothing—a light T-shirt only provides SPF protection of about 5 to 8.
- Reapply after swimming or sweating and about two hours after the first application.
- Stay away from flame sources when using spray-on sunscreen as it may be flammable.
- If you avoid being in the sun, remember to check your vitamin D level; about 25% of Americans have low levels of vitamin D.
