DISTRICT MOVES TO COMMEMORATE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE REMEMBRANCE DAY

At the meeting of the LAUSD Board of Education on Tuesday, October 6, members voted unanimously to make April 24 a school holiday to commemorate the Armenian Genocide of 1915, carried out by Turkey that killed 1.5 million Armenians. The resolution was introduced by Board Member **Kelly Gonez** who said, “This change in our calendar shows Los Angeles Unified’s commitment and solidarity to our Armenian community, especially during this trying time, to recognize and tell the truth about their history. Moreover, all students, regardless of their background, will benefit from learning about the Armenian Genocide as we teach tolerance and empower future generations to prevent recurrence of genocide.”

The formal recognition of Armenian Genocide Remembrance Day is especially relevant in that the Turkish government, which still denies the 1915 genocide, joined Azerbaijan on September 27, 2020, in an unwarranted attack on indigenous Armenians in Nagorno-Karabakh (Artsakh). AALA stands with the LAUSD Armenian Educators Association, **Mayor Garcetti**, the L.A. City Council, the Board of Education, and numerous other organizations in denouncing Turkey and Azerbaijan for these actions.

**HEALTHCARE FAQs—
COMPARISON OF PLANS FOR MEDICARE RETIREES**

NOTICE TO ALL RETIREES

Your open enrollment letter calls for a “mandatory online registration” process. Please note that **you do not have to activate your registration log-on** if you are not making any changes. If you wish to make changes but prefer to do so by phone, you may call the District. AALA will post the Call Center number as soon as it becomes available.

Retirees age 65 or over must have Medicare Parts A and B to enroll in one of three District Medicare Advantage plans—Kaiser Senior Advantage, Health Net Seniority Plus, and Anthem Medicare Preferred (PPO). In these plans, Medicare pays insurers to cover all Medicare Part A (hospital) and Part B (medical) benefits. With the open enrollment period just around the corner, from October 26 through November 22, 2020, we offer this at-a-glance comparison of Medicare retiree plans.

IN RECOGNITION OF FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

As a proud second generation Filipino American, I am happy that our District has recognized Filipino American History Month. We are the second largest Asian American group in the nation and the third largest ethnic group in California. Filipino Americans have participated in social justice movements such as the United Farmworkers Movement, the fight for ethnic studies, Hawaii sugar plantation strikes, Washington Yakima strikes, and anti-martial law movements across multiple decades.

As of 2009, October has been recognized as Filipino American History Month by the U.S. Congress. On October 2, 2015, 175 Filipino American leaders met for the first White House celebration of Filipino American History Month. Last school year, LAUSD Student Board Member **Frances Suavillo** authored the [resolution](#) where Filipino American History Month was officially recognized in LAUSD.

Approximately 150,000 Filipino American nurses are working in the United States. Filipinos make up 20% of the nursing force in California. In Student Health and Human Services (SHHS), this is also reflective of our nurses and medical staff. They put their lives at risk and are [disproportionately affected by the coronavirus](#). As the District launched and ramped up its COVID-19 testing program, I have been thinking about all our staff, particularly those in District Nursing Services (DNS) and Student Medical Services, who are on the front lines of testing as well notifying student and staff of results. DNS is 30% of our SHHS Division and 87% of DNS identifies as Filipino.

I have also been reflecting on my Filipina mom who for the last 51 years has worked as a clinical laboratory scientist in a hospital. In her mid-70s, she directly analyzes COVID-19 tests and has firsthand seen the impact of this pandemic. Although in a risk category for her age and exposure to the virus, her dedication and compassion as an essential worker are common amongst Filipinos who give of themselves to the community and others first.

Historically, Filipino Americans have been at the forefront and continue to fight for health, [human rights](#), and [dignity for all](#). In our District, my Filipino American role model who embodies this is Eagle Rock Junior/High School Principal **Mylene Keipp**. Ms. Keipp tirelessly advocates for all of her students, embedding wellness, mental health, and a social emotional lens to the school community on all levels.

I am inherently proud of my heritage, knowing at a profound level the struggle my mother, as an immigrant, gave to serve others while leaving her home country and family behind. I also believe that all of us are the continuation of the dream of our ancestors and in our collective spirit fighting and creating abundance for all. In closing, I am sharing parts of the poem “If You Want to Know What We Are” by Filipino American writer **Carlos Bulosan**.

“We are the sufferers who suffer for natural love
of man for man, who commemorate the humanities
of every man; we are the toilers who toil
to make the starved earth a place of abundance
who transform abundance into deathless fragrance.

We are the men and women reading books, searching
in the pages of history for the lost word, the key
to the mystery of living peace, imperishable joy;
we are factory hands field hands mill hand everywhere,
molding creating building structures, forging ahead,

Reaching for the future, nourished in the heart;
we are doctors scientists chemists discovering,
eliminating disease and hunger and antagonisms;
we are soldiers navy-men citizens guarding
the imperishable will of man to live in grandeur,

We are the living dream of dead men everywhere.”

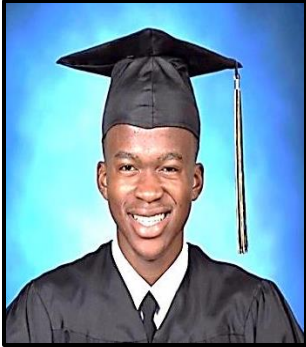
